

Saint Marys Consultants Report

August 13th, September 8th, September 13th, October 10th

12 hours total

In my opinion the stripping, leveling and seeding of all of 8 green and 1/3 of 1 green went very well. I was on site during on September the 8th to oversee the project. Germination has been very spotty to this point and I told Tom to put more seed down in the bare areas and continue watering. I also told Tom to put down a granular fertilizer application on these greens and water it in. These greens need a lot of attention to get them open by May of next year.

During my last visit the golf course looked pretty good. The fairways could benefit from a late October fertilization, a 1-0-1 ratio of bulk fertilizer from a local supplier would be a inexpensive source.

We attempted to have a contractor over seed the remaining greens, but their equipment broke down after 2 greens. Tom was told to over seed the remaining bad spots by disrupting the surface and dropping seed with the drop spreader.

Tom has also aerified and seeded the green surrounds, they will probably need another overseeding in the spring, as they were very thin.
