

**RESOLUTION NO. 08-20 – MASTER FEE RESOLUTION**

**A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING FEES AND RATES FOR UTILITY SERVICES, FOR THE CITY OF ST. MARYS, KANSAS.**

WHEREAS, the City of St. Marys must assess charges for certain utility services that it provides, as authorized by the governing body of the City of St. Marys; and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Marys needs to review as necessary and adjust said fees in order to cover the expense of providing the services; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the governing body of the City of St. Marys, that this fee schedule be established:

**Section 1. New Connection Charges; Water: (17-104)**

- a) ¾ inch, \$500.00 at the time of application. **(17-205a)**
- b) In excess of ¾ inches, \$500.00, plus the actual cost of the meter and installation that is in excess of the ¾ inch service. **(17-205b)**
- c) Connection charges (tap fees) for applicants outside the city limits shall be double the comparable city unit charges. **(17-205c)**
- d) ¾ inch, \$250.00 (irrigation meter) at the time of application. **(17-205f)**

**Section 2. Rates; Water: (17-208)**

- a) SAME, WITHIN CITY:
  - 1) Residential (minimum monthly base charge) .....\$ 8.00
  - 2) Commercial (minimum monthly base charge) .....\$ 8.00
  - 3) Meter for outside watering (min. monthly base charge).....\$ 2.00
  - 4) Per 1,000 gallons.....\$ 3.25
- b) SAME, OUTSIDE CITY:
  - 1) Residential (minimum monthly base charge) .....\$ 8.40
  - 2) Commercial (minimum monthly base charge) .....\$ 8.40
  - 3) Per 1,000 gallons.....\$ 3.45
- c) SAME, SPECIAL BENEFIT DISTRICT:
  - 1) Residential (minimum monthly base charge) .....\$ 8.40
  - 2) Commercial (minimum monthly base charge) .....\$ 8.40
  - 3) Per 1,000 gallons.....\$ 3.45
- d) SAME, VIOLATIONS, DISCONNECTIONS AND PENALTIES: (17-707)
  - 1) Disconnect Fee.....\$ 50.00

**Section 3. New Connection Charges; Electrical: (17-104, 17-302, 17-303)**

- a) Residential
  - 1) Single Phase .....\$200.00
  - 2) Three Phase.....\$350.00
- b) Small Power Commercial
  - 1) Single Phase .....\$350.00
- c) Large Power Commercial
  - 1) Three Phase w/demand .....\$350.00
- d) Connection charges for applicants outside the city limits shall be double the comparable city unit charges. **(17-303g)**

**Section 4. Rates; Residential Electrical Service: (17-310)**

- a) Within City: **(17-310, 17-306b)**
  - 1) Energy Charge per kWh/mo. ....\$ 0.11 per kWh
  - 2) Minimum Monthly Base Charge .....\$10.00
  - 3) Security light.....\$ 8.50 per month
- b) Rural: **(17-310, 17-306b)**
  - 1) Energy Charge per kWh/mo. ....\$ 0.1155 per kWh
  - 2) Minimum Monthly Base Charge .....\$10.50
  - 3) Security light.....\$ 8.93 per month

**Section 5. Rates; Small Commercial Electrical Service: (17-306c)**

- a) Within City: **(17-312, 17-306c, 17-306d)**
  - 1) Energy Charge per kWh/mo. ....\$ 0.11 per kWh
  - 2) Minimum Monthly Base Charge. ....\$10.00
  - 3) Security light.....\$ 8.50 per month
- b) Rural: **(17-312, 17-306c, 17-306d)**
  - 1) Energy Charge per kWh/mo. ....\$ 0.1155 per kWh
  - 2) Minimum Monthly Base Charge. ....\$10.50
  - 3) Security light.....\$ 8.93 per month

**Section 6. Rates; Large Commercial Electrical Service: (17-315, 17-306c, 17-306d)**

- a) Within City:
  - 1) Energy Charge per kWh/mo... ..\$ 0.0955 per kWh
  - 2) Minimum Monthly Base Charge .....\$10.00
  - 3) Demand Charge per KW.....\$ 4.00
  - 4) Security light.....\$ 8.50 per month

b) Rural:

- 1) Energy Charge per kWh/mo... ..\$ 0.1003 per kWh
- 2) Minimum Monthly Base Charge .....\$10.50
- 3) Demand Charge per KW.....\$ 4.20
- 4) Security light.....\$ 8.93 per month

**Section 7. Parallel Generation Charges:** applicable to all customer classes of electrical service.

- 1) Parallel Generation Fee – in addition to the Minimum Monthly Base Charge all interconnected parallel generation shall be billed a monthly Parallel Generation Fee based off of the calculations from the KPP Member Solar Parallel Generation Customers spreadsheet, originally adopted via Resolution No. 07-20.
- 2) Customer Billing Credit - the billing credit for surplus energy generated by the Generation Facility and delivered to the Electric Distribution System that exceeds the Customer's instantaneous load but is not in excess of the appropriate generator size, the city shall credit one hundred and fifty percent (150%) of the system average cost of energy in \$/kWh for the periods in which energy was delivered to the city.
- 3) Customer Billing - the measurement of net electricity supplied by the Electric Utility and delivered to the Electric Utility shall be calculated in the following manner. Electric Utility shall measure the amount of electricity delivered by Electric Utility to Customer and the amount of electricity generated by the Customer and delivered to Electric Utility during the billing period, in accordance with normal metering practices. The kWh delivered by Electric Utility to the Customer shall be billed to the Customer at the rates contained in this resolution. The kWh generated by the Customer and delivered to the Electric Utility shall be credited as described in Customer Billing Credit. The calculated credit (\$) applied to the bill will not result in a total bill less than the Minimum Monthly Base Charge plus the Parallel Generation Fee.

**Section 8. New Connection Charges; Sewage: (17-104, 17-403, 17-403a, 17-403d, 17-408)**

a) Residential connections within the city:

- 1) Single Family.....\$500.00
- 2) Mobile homes (per unit) .....\$500.00
- 3) Multi-family .....\$550.00  
Plus \$150.00 for each living unit over two.
- 4) Motel (each structure).....\$550.00  
Plus \$100.00 for each unit over two.

- b) Residential accessory building, detached garage, or storage building located on the same building lot or tract as the primary building will be \$200.00.
- c) Other new connections, other than industrial, up to 7,500 sq. ft. \$550.00, plus \$75.00 for each additional 5000 sq. ft.
- d) Connection charges (tap fees) for applicants outside the city limits shall be double the comparable city unit charges.

**Section 9. Rates; Sewage Service: (17-403, 17-403a, 17-403b, 17-403c, 17-408)**

a) Within City (not within a special benefit district):

1) For residential customers:

- a. Minimum monthly base charge .....\$26.50
- b. Per each 1,000 gallons .....\$ 3.50

2) For commercial customers:

- a. Minimum monthly base charge .....\$26.50
- b. Per each 1,000 gallons .....\$ 3.50

3) For industrial customers:

- a. Minimum monthly base charge .....\$26.50
- b. Per each 1,000 gallons .....\$ 3.50

b) Outside City (not within a special benefit district):

1) For residential customers:

- a. Minimum monthly base charge .....\$27.82
- b. Per each 1,000 gallons .....\$ 3.67

2) For commercial customers:

- a. Minimum monthly base charge .....\$27.82
- b. Per each 1,000 gallons .....\$ 3.67

3) For industrial customers:

- a. Minimum monthly base charge .....\$27.82
- b. Per each 1,000 gallons .....\$ 3.67

c) Special Benefit District:

1) For residential customers:

- a. Minimum monthly base charge .....\$27.82
- b. Per each 1,000 gallons .....\$ 3.67

2) For commercial customers:

- a. Minimum monthly base charge .....\$27.82
- b. Per each 1,000 gallons .....\$ 3.67

- 3) For industrial customers:
  - a. Minimum monthly base charge .....\$27.82
  - b. Per each 1,000 gallons .....\$ 3.67

**Section 10. Refuse Charges: (17-505, 17-507, 17-508, 17-514a, 17-514b, 17-514c)**

**a) Residential Rates – once per week**

- 1) Residential provided container (or no container).....\$16.01
- 2) Contractor provided Toter (1).....\$17.02
- 3) Contractor provided Toters (2) .....\$18.04
- 4) Contractor provided Toters (3) .....\$23.12

**b) Commercial Rates**

**d) Administrative Fee – there shall be a \$1.00 administrative fee added to each refuse customer’s bill.**

**Section 11. Service Charges; Other: (17-118, 17-119, 17-120a, 17-125a, 17-203b, 17-203a)**

- a) Service Charges .....\$25.00
- b) Administrative Fee (other than Landlords).....\$40.00
- c) Administrative Fee (for Landlords) .....\$15.00
- d) Disconnect Charges (per meter).....\$50.00
- e) Bad Checks and Bank Drafts .....\$40.00

Bulk Water

- f) Bulk Water Account Set Up Fee (for Section 10e customers).....\$50.00
- g) Bulk water obtained from fire hydrant (per 1,000 gallons) .....\$ 3.50
- h) Bulk water obtained from water salesman (approx. 35 gallons) ....\$ 0.25

Note: Bulk Water Account customers are required to pay the Set Up Fee as per Section 10f), and are also required to completely fill out an Account Set Up application.

**Section 12. Power Loss Multiplier = 1.1**

When electricity is transmitted between two locations a fractional amount of it is lost during the transmission process (through heat). In addition, electricity is used by the city for its operations. Therefore, the Power Loss Multiplier is used to account for the electricity lost during transmission and the power used by the city to operate its operations.

**Section 13. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall repeal and replace Resolution No. 05-20 Master Fee Resolution, and take effect and be in force after its adoption and concurrent with the December 2020 billing date.
